DNR Partnership for Thriving Loons

On April 20th, 2010, BP's Deepwater Horizon drilling unit exploded, resulting in a massive release of oil and causing extensive natural resource injuries from Texas to Florida. While this environmental tragedy seems far removed from Minnesota, it impacted a local favorite species; the Common Loon, which migrates to the Gulf of Mexico's waters!

As part of a 2016 settlement, BP agreed to pay over \$8.1 billion in natural resource damages. Part of those dollars fund the Restoration of Common Loons in Minnesota project, designed to reduce mortality and increase the number of young loons produced in Minnesota. The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources manages the program, and the Mississippi Headwaters Audubon Society is partnering with our local DNR Loon Specialist, Jayden Jech, to do our part at the Neilson Spearhead Center.

We are excited to partner with the DNR to help ensure a thriving population of Common Loons in Minnesota well into the future!


